You also are keeping your family plots neat and you continue to contribute to the cemetery fund that provides for the ongoing maintenance. You have been so good and we on the committee appreciate you so much. I want also to thank our committee for their work in maintaining our historic cemetery.

We are in need of some more people to work on the committee. We now have a good number but some have not been able to be active. If you would like to help as a volunteer; please let me know. We would like to ask you that are interested to commit if possible to be at the 4 meetings and 2 workdays each year. Also, throughout the year we may do some extra work but historically it hasn't been very much. Please let me know if you are interested.

We are in the process of determining grave sites that are possibly available for sale. We are asking you if you own grave sites that don't have some sort of coping around it, to do the coping ASAP and notify us so we don't

include it in our list of grave sites for sale. Thank you so much for your help.

PROJECTS

Because of the LORD's help, the committee's work, and your support, several good projects have been completed.

Some that need to be completed are: 1. Installation of a large monument with the names of those buried in unmarked graves that we have on hand. 2. Attaching a number on the plat for the newly installed unknown markers. 3. Determine grave sites available for possible sale.

If you have some sites that you feel will never be used, you can donate them back to the cemetery committee for a tax donation. This will help in using the empty sites and contribute to the ongoing maintenance of the cemetery work.

COPING

As I referred to earlier and have several times in the past, please put coping around your site. This is, because of limited records, our only way of knowing if it belongs to someone. This is now most important as we work to determine gravesites available for possible sale.

MAILING LIST

Please ask your family to have their names and addresses placed on our mailing list. This is the life blood of our cemetery fund. We absolutely don't share this with anyone else. It is simply used to keep family members informed.

BEFORE YOU DIG

You must notify Chris Rutledge, 770-861-2528 before you have a grave dug. This way we can better manage the cemetery and know who is buried where. Also, when you have a grave dug, notify the funeral home not to dump excess dirt οn church/cemetery property. have no place to put it. If it does happen a \$1000.00 charge will be charged to the funeral home. They must take it with them.

WORK DAYS

We have 2 each year the Saturday before Thanksgiving and the third Saturday in April and we invite you to come and help. I would like to thank publicly those that worked the last 2 workdays; Tony Stevens, Rickey Brooks, Susan Pierson, Chloe Rutledge, Kristy McCullers, Jim Coker, Janice & Larry Rutledge. Even though we have a company that maintains the cemetery, we mainly tidy up and do away with old bad looking flowers. We start work at 10 am and usually finish by 1 pm.

CLEANING POLICY

We as a committee normally do not work inside a family plot but we will do away with old looking flowers, etc. We ask you to please keep your flowers changed out before we have to do it.

MEMORIAL SERVICE

The last service was our 12th annual one held April 24, 2016. We had a very good attendance. Chloe Rutledge gave a presentation of Mr. Austin Webb who is the man that donated land for the first church building here. We had several members from

We plan to remember those that have given so much to protect our country and others around the world and most of all to honor our Lord Jesus Christ. It will be held at 3:00 pm.

PEOPLE OF THE PAST Wendell and Mary Hewatt

Over the years, the Hewatt family has served the Gwinnett County community as preachers, produce peddlers, and store proprietors. Primitive Baptists would travel to hear preacher Joseph Crancel Hewatt (b. May 17, 1867, d. February 18, 1948) deliver a rousing sermon, and his son Henry Thomas Hewatt (b. June 22, 1897, d. August 28, 1968) rode through local towns selling produce from the back of his truck. But, it was Henry and his wife Nellie Mae's son, Wendell

Thomas Hewatt, born on May 3, 1915, and Wendell's wife Mary Elizabeth Kilgore, born March 4, 1919, that brought the Hewatt family to Lenora Church Road. Having married during the Great Depression on April 17, 1937, Wendell and Mary had moved their family sixteen times before enough saving money purchase the four room Lenora schoolhouse for a home in 1948. They moved in with their three sons, Glenn, Franklin and Alfred, and only daughter, Joann, and began operating the small convenience store that was also on the property. Along with gas, the store sold small items like candy and tobacco, and local men could often be found playing checkers around the heater, which was a pot belly stove. In 1951, Wendell and Mary had another son, Marvin, completing a blessed family of five children.

In addition to managing the store on Lenora Church Road, Wendell and Mary had several occupations. At the age of 13, Wendell went to work at Mac Brannan's Store Stone in Mountain to help support his brothers and sisters. It was a job that would become part of the Hewatt legacy as the Hewatt children continue to own and operate convenience stores today.

After marrying, Wendell was a spinner at Milstead Mills, produce truck driver, and a Gwinnett County bus driver. He also operated another store on Hwy. 78 in Stone Mountain.

Wendell was a young deacon at

Haynes Creek and often made appearances with his oxen-pulled covered wagon at the Gwinnett County Fair. Many children who grew up on Lenora Church Road have photos of themselves with big grins sitting on the wagon seat behind the oxen

Mary helped run the store and manage the family's money while working at Walton Manufacturing, which made men's suits, in Loganville. She was an excellent cook, known for her fried chicken, hot biscuits and sweet potato pie, and a skilled seamstress and quilter. She made quilts for every family member, even preparing several for future great grandchildren she would never meet. Mary was a faithful member of Lenora Baptist Church.

Wendell had a massive heart attack and passed away in 1968. The service was at Haynes Creek with three preachers, and he was buried at Haynes Creek. Mary passed August 24, 1995 and was also buried at Haynes Creek.

Both Henry and Nellie Mae are buried at Haynes Creek.
