PROJECTS

In September of 2017, hurricane Irma blew a large tree down falling toward a neighboring home in the subdivision to the south of our property. Fortunately, it did not hurt anyone and didn't hit the house but did damage to the fence. Because the tree was live and

blew down during a storm, we had no liability. Because of this, we surveyed other trees on the cemetery property that grew large and were leaning toward another home. After surveying the situation and finding the property line corner (which took lots of work because the corner marker was buried in about 5 inches of dirt) we decided which trees might need to be taken down.

Because of God's blessings and your help thru your donations we were able to have several trees that seemed to pose a danger to our neighbor next to our property taken down. Now, hopefully, we have avoided a possible hazard and in the process was able to identify and clearly mark the property line in this oldest section, which is the SW corner of the property.

Thanks to the Lord, the Committee and you we have been able to complete several projects in the cemetery. There is more that have been identified yet to be completed. 1. Attach a number on the plat of the unmarked stones placed as a result of the GPR work that found unmarked graves. 2. Installation of a large monument with names, etc. of people buried in unmarked graves that we have acquired over the past years. 3.

COPING

As I referred to earlier and have several times in the past, please put coping around your site. This is, because of limited records, our only way of knowing if it belongs to someone. This is now most important as we work to

determine gravesites available for possible sale.

MAILING LIST

Please ask your family to have their names and addresses placed on our mailing list. This is the life blood of our cemetery fund. We absolutely don't share this with anyone else. It is simply used to keep family members informed.

BEFORE YOU DIG

You must notify Chris Rutledge, 770-861-2528 before you have a grave dug. This way we can better manage the cemetery and know who is buried where. Also, when you have a grave dug, notify the funeral home not to dump excess dirt on church/cemetery property. We have no place to put it. If it does happen a \$1000.00 charge will be charged to the funeral home. They must take it with them.

WORK DAYS

We have 2 each year, the Saturday before Thanksgiving and the third Saturday in April and we invite you to come and help. I would like to thank publicly those that worked the last 2 workdays, Susan Pierson, Don Webb, Adam Webb, Jim Coker, Chris Rutledge, Rickey Brooks, Larry & Janice Rutledge. Even though we have a company that maintains the cemetery, we mainly tidy up and do away with old bad looking flowers. We start work at 10 a.m. and usually finish by 1 p.m.

CLEANING POLICY

We as a committee normally do not work inside a family plot but we will do away with old looking flowers, etc. We ask you to please keep your flowers changed out before we have to do it.

MEMORIAL SERVICE

He was born in Atlanta, Georgia
to Martha and Ernest Billingsley
and had a brother William who
was also a pilot. He was raised
in Chattanooga, Tennessee. He
attended Georgia Tech and from
his childhood he always wanted
to be a pilot. He would,
according to his mom, turn
rockers over on the porch and
pretend he was flying an
airplane.

He joined the Air Force before he finished Tech and became a fighter pilot, serving in The Air Defense Command stationed in Everett, Washington. Thule, Greenland and Homestead Air Force Base, Florida. He flew the F102, the F104 which was called the Star Fighter. After 12 years (1954 – 1966) in the Air Force he worked for Eastern Air Lines for 21 years.

He was married to Norma Jo Bailey and had 4 children, (lost one at birth). He lived only long enough to see one of his 5 grandchildren.

He absolutely loved to fly. The poem read at the memorial service for our astronauts was also his favorite.
